Learning outcomes	The purpose of this seminar is to enable students to combine the option of a specialized subject with the opportunity to attend a range of initiatives (lectures, workshops, etc.) of their choice since they fit within the same specialized area. The seminar aims to provide students with a space for critical reflection on the current national and international debates on relevant topics for their PhD theses and, at the same time, to encourage them to engage with the existing research networks and projects in their subject.
Syllabus	There is no pre-established programme for the seminar. The syllabus will be selected in line with the objectives of the curricular unit, which are to broaden PhD students' perspectives on how to approach the subject-matter of their doctoral theses and to engage them in new interpretations and the current research debates in their fields of interest.
Bibliography (core)	Specific to each lecture topic. To be set by the lecturer and the coordinators as well as researched by the student.
Bibliography (complementary)	Specific to each lecture topic. To be set by the lecturer and the coordinators as well as researched by the student.
Evaluation Criteria	The students should attend between four and six lectures over the semester, half of which must be in the field of History. The seminar coordinators will approve the final proposals submitted by the students. Attendance certificates of the activities selected are requested. The final evaluation will consist of: a) a written report of 3,500–4,500 words that analyses critically the contribution of three lectures

	attended to the student's PhD thesis; b) an oral discussion of the written report.
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
